Welcome to our study on Joseph. We will work through the story each week from January to March (with a few breaks for special services).

It is a story that is perhaps familiar to many due to Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical 'Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat.' We all know about the 'coat of many colours' but the story is much more than that.

We are given a window on Joseph's life from his teenage years to his death, from a dreamer to the Egyptian chancellor of the exchequer, from being rejected by his family to reunification, from being falsely accused, imprisoned, forgotten, to being restored.

In this story we perhaps see glimpses of own lives, but the underlying theme is that through all these seasons of Joseph's life, God was there - just as he is with ours.

We welcome any feedback at the end of the series and any suggestions as to how it could be improved or done differently.

So enjoy the journey with us and the Elders pray God will enrich you through this study.

Each week there will be the designated scripture reading.

The preachers will treat the material differently, but we have included some main points and other references for consideration. Although we aim to record the message each week, these pointers will help you understand the chapter.

There are finally some questions for you to reflect on during the week, perhaps in your own quiet times or maybe you want to discuss them with others at Coffee Morning or after the Sunday Services.

Theme: Dreams Scripture: Genesis 37:1–11

Key Teaching Points:

God calls us even when we are young and untested.
Jealousy and dysfunction cannot erase God's plan.
God's dreams for us are bigger than our immediate circumstances.

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SESSION 2

Theme: Betrayal Scripture: Genesis 37:12–36

Key Teaching Points:

Betrayal wounds deeply, but God's presence is constant.
Human evil cannot defeat God's purposes.
God remembers us when others forget.

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SESSION 3

Theme: Integrity Scripture: Genesis 39:1–20

Key Teaching Points:

Integrity is tested in private, unseen places.

Resisting temptation often comes with short-term cost but long-term blessing.

God honours faithfulness even when the world punishes it.

Waiting shapes character.

God prepares us through trials for greater service.
